#### 1900. Mobile meals delivery:

#### 1905. Miracle Hill Ministries:

#### 1906. Greater Spartanburg Ministries:

#### 1907. Total Ministries:

#### 1908. Epworth Children's Home:

Epworth Children's Home ministers to children, youth and families. Many of the children at Epworth will never be going home. There is little hope for adoption. Epworth is their only home. #### 1909. The Haven Family Rescue Mission:

This homeless shelter for men, women and women with children under the age of 11 provides three meals a day, clothing, Christian counseling, and a Fresh Start Work Force Reentry program. They also operate a thrift store. Volunteer opportunities include adopting (decorating) a room, tutoring children, assisting with children's activities, providing office support, and donations coordinator.
